# Flood Insurance



- Flooding conditions can occur year-round, and you do not have to live in the 100-year floodplain to be at risk.
- Approximately 68% of flood loss claims from Hurricane Harvey were outside of the FEMA mapped 100-year floodplain.


- 181 projects across all watersheds (37 left to initiate)



# Flood Damage Reduction Project Lifecycle





### **Bond Program Update**

#### Construction

- \$303M awarded since Aug 2018 (45 Projects)
- \$37M on the street bidding right now
- Bid \$94M in projects since January 2020
- \$447M planned advertisements through end of year
- Currently over \$400M in active construction

Overall – Total ~\$4 Billion in project value underway

- 2<sup>nd</sup> Quartile projects all authorized in April 2020
- 105 Neighborhood Drainage Improvement Projects (Harris County Engineering) underway
- Capital Improvement Program averaging \$40M per month
- Purchased over 500 homes via buyout program



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

#### CAPITAL AND BOND FUNDED PROJECTS

#### **BUILDING OUR INFRASTRUCTURE**

Capital projects reduce flooding risks and damages by expanding channels or constructing new stormwater detention basins or buying out floodprone homes. Bond funding, federal grants and local partnerships help finance these projects.

# Federal and State Funding Pursuits

#### Total federal grants APPROVED

Total - \$872M (\$678 / \$257M)

#### Corps

- Clear Creek Progressive Design Build RFQ later this year
- \$6M Buffalo Bayou and Tributaries Resiliency Study draft report to be released this summer

#### Texas Water Development Board


- Submitted 9 abridged applications
- \$34M local / \$71M grant / \$202M loan ~ \$307M total

#### GLO and CDBG-MIT grant applications

 6 applications ~\$50M to \$100M range each due this October

Addicks and Barker Reservoirs

#### White Oak Bayou

- 15.3 miles grass-lined channel conveyance improvements
- · 4 detention basin complexes (350 acres / 2,950 acre-feet)
- · 12 miles of linear park/trails along the channel, and other recreation features

#### Active Construction

Final basin (Mar 2020)

#### Remaining Construction

- Upstream channel (Dec 2021)
- Downstream channel (Oct 2021)

Project Complete: December 2021

#### **Brays Bayou**

- 21.2 miles channel conveyance Completed Construction improvements
- 4 detention basin complexes (850 acres / 11,500 acre-feet)
- 30 bridge replacements/ modifications
- One bridge (Aug 2019)
- Active Construction
- · Upstream channel + 2 bridge mods (Dec 2019)
- 4 bridges (May-Dec 2020)

#### Remaining Construction

· 7 bridges (Dec 2021)

Project Complete: December 2021

#### **Hunting Bayou**

- · 3.8 miles grass-lined channel conveyance improvements
- One detention basin (75 acres / 1.000 acre-feet)
- · 17 bridge replacements/ modifications
- **Active Construction**
- Pedestrian bridges (May 2020)

#### Remaining Construction

- · Upstream channel (Jun 2021)
- Downstream channel (Dec 2021)
- · Railroad bridges (Dec 2020)

Project Complete: December 2021

#### Clear Creek (upstream of I-45)

- · 20.4 miles channel correction al Design improvements on Clea Aug 2020
- and tributaries Detailed schedule to be developed pending
- /lud Gully (Dec 2019)
- 500 acre-feet in-line detention Second outlet channel and gated structure complete, ?
- analysis of procurement method for remainder of project.
- bridges replaced or modific 2026 downstream of IH-45



#### **Buffalo Bayou and Tributaries Resiliency Study**

- · Assess flood risks upstream and downstream of Addicks and Barker reservoirs under existing and future conditions. Conditions have changed significantly since the project was built in the 1940s.
- · Recommend operational changes and/or physical projects to improve the effectiveness of the reservoirs in reducing flood risks upstream and
- · Complete study in partnership with HCFCD in three years or fewer.
- Expedite processes to implement recommendations.

# **Clear Creek**

- One of 2 projects nationwide executed under Section 1043(b) authority of WRRDA 2014
- The Mud Gully portion bidding this month ~\$10.2M
- The remainder of the federal project is in preliminary engineering including a drainage analysis and conceptual plan update, with construction expected to begin in 2021.
- Updating hydrology and hydraulics
- Hundreds of parcel acquisitions including outside Harris County
- Additional utilities and other physical changes in last 8 years



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# Community Engagement & Task Force Update

- Harris County Flood Control Task Force created 1972
- Worked well over the years for community input
- Repurpose to the Harris County Community Resiliency Task Force
- Focus areas include transportation, flood control, housing, budgeting, economic equity and opportunity
- Revised bylaws to go before Commissioners Court in August

# PLANNING \$47 MILLION

- Update Floodplain Mapping
- Coordinated Regional Planning
- State Flood Plan

# FUNDING \$ 1.4 BILLION

- Texas Infrastructure Resiliency Fund (TIRF)
- Hurricane Harvey Account \$638M
  - TWDB to provide funding to TDEM
  - Hazard Mitigation Grant Program \$273M
  - Public Assistance Grant Program \$365M
- Floodplain Management Account \$47M
- Flood Infrastructure Fund (FIF) \$793M








### Regional Flood Plan Components



Identify specific flood risk, existing & future condition flood risk analyses




Base Level Engineering as Supporting Data for Planning




# LIDAR STATUS — CURRENTLY AVAILABLE




# LIDAR STATUS – IN PRODUCTION/PENDING RELEASE


Digital FEMA Flood Insurance Rate Map Guadalupe County





# FLOOD INFRASTRUCTURE FUND (fif) Funding Cycle


