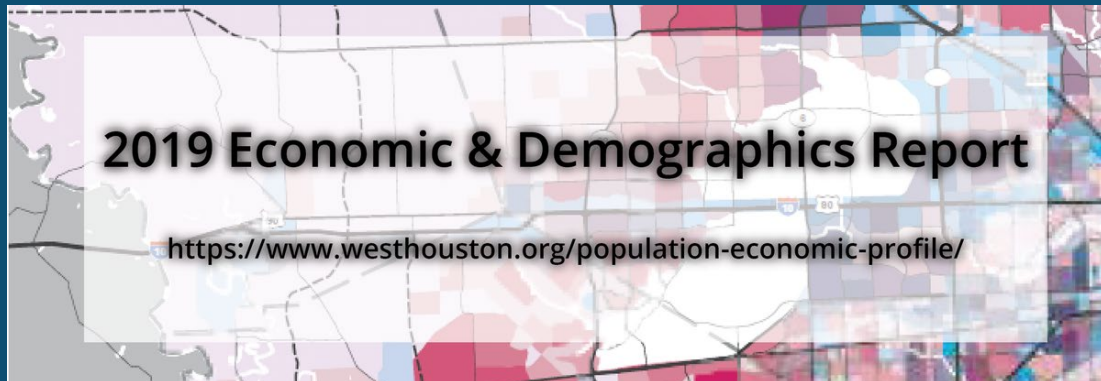
COMMITTEE UPDATES :
